

Evidence Of Identity

The information below is taken from the Motor Vehicle (Driving Licences) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1996 and outlines the alternative evidence, which can be produced prior to the practical driving test. (See regulation 27 (2) & (4))

SCHEDULE 5

Regulation 27

1. The documents referred to in regulation 27 (2) and (4) are:-

- (a) a passport;
- (b) a cheque guarantee card or credit card bearing a photograph and signature of the person;
- (c) an employer's identity card bearing a photograph and signature of the person;
- (d) a trade union card bearing a photograph and signature of the person;
- (e) a photograph of the person which has been endorsed with a certificate in the prescribed form signed by an acceptable person.

2. In this Schedule

“acceptable person” means a Member of Parliament, district council councillor, Justice of the Peace, a minister of religion, barrister, solicitor, teacher, medical practitioner, bank official, established civil servant or police officer.

“the prescribed form”, in relation to a certificate, means the following
