

Driver and Vehicle testing in adverse weather – mainly during the months October to April

From time to time, adverse weather can impact on the Agency's ability to deliver Vehicle and Driver Tests. The Met Office has forecast colder weather with frost and snow showers becoming increasingly likely. As a result some driving tests may be affected by severe winter weather conditions over the next few days and weeks.

Practical Driving Tests

Practical driving tests are managed locally on a test by test basis, subject to local conditions which are reviewed regularly throughout the day. All attempts will be made to cancel tests in advance; however this is not always possible as local conditions can change quite quickly.

It is normally the 8.50am and 9.50am tests that are affected however in extreme conditions all tests may be cancelled. Please check with your test centre if your test will be going ahead before arriving at the test centre.

In the event that your driving test is cancelled, another appointment will be arranged automatically at no further cost, but compensation is not payable. You will be contacted with a new appointment date as soon as possible.

Note: Candidates who have their test cancelled will be not be compensated for any pre-test lessons or associated costs.

Vehicle Testing

Vehicle Testing is not normally affected by adverse weather conditions. In exceptional circumstances, where customers are unable to attend due to adverse weather, the agency will reschedule the test at no additional cost.
